1. What is Idlewells Shopping Centre?

Idlewells Shopping Centre is in Sutton-In-Ashfield. It is a place where people come to shop, meet friends, eat and drink - and relax.

There are around 50 shops and stalls inside the Shopping Centre - all under one roof. Each shop sells different types of goods or services, and is run by a person or business that rents the shop from the Shopping Centre team.

There is also a Library, a central Café and an Indoor Market inside the Shopping Centre. The bus station is located at one of its three large entrances, to make it easy for people to travel to.



2. What day am I going to Idlewells Shopping Centre?

Plus... Every Tuesday 3pm-6pm, we hold a **SimpleShopping** session, during which time there is, amongst other things, no music and no pre-planned alarm tests or announcements in the Centre. We ask our shoppers to be considerate via notices - and the individual shops to do the same. Find more information on our website under 'Accessibility'.

Alarm testing is:

9am - 10am every morning.

More specifically: Every Tuesday at 9.15am for the Shopping Centre and every morning between 9am - 10am for the individual shops in the Centre.

4. How will I get to Idlewells Shopping Centre?





Car

If you are coming in a car, you can park in our multi-storey car park. Sat Nav for car park is: NG17 1AG

- It holds the Park Mark Safer Parking award.
- There is a 6ft or 1.8M height restriction.



• Blue badge holders can park in blue badge spaces on levels 2, 4 and 6. They are closest to the lifts and are marked in blue.

• Parent and child spaces are available on level 2, 4 and 6 and are marked in dark pink.

Pay at the machine:

• You will need to remember, write down or take a photo of your vehicle registration number as you need this to pay at the end of your visit.

• Payment for parking is made before you leave the Centre. There are two payment kiosks, located on Market Mall by the lobby to the lifts.

• Parking charges are displayed at the entrance to the car park and are also on our website.

- 4. Payment will automatically be taken

Bus

If you don't have your own vehicle, you can take the bus. Buses drop off at Sutton bus station and the entrance to Idlewells Shopping Centre is located by the library.



Taxi

You can travel by taxi. Ask them to drop you off by Ladbrokes. You will enter the shopping centre up the steps or the access ramp.



Walk

You can walk to Idlewells Shopping Centre. There are 4 ways in which you can enter the centre.

6. How do I find the toilets in Idlewells Shopping Centre?

Here are some ways to quickly find the toilets in Idlewells Shopping Centre:

- Refer to the Floor Plan at the back of this guide
- Follow the signs to the toilets
- Ask any member of our team, or any member of shop staff
- The toilets are located through the Lift Lobby near to the Indoor Market main entrance from the Centre



Using the public toilets

- If you have a disability and require use of the accessible toilet, you can use a RADAR key or ask a member of our team to open it up for you
- There are baby changing and feeding rooms, available for use, Please ask a member of our team to open it up for you.

7. What do I do if something goes wrong? Finding help

If you need help, you can ask any of the Idlewells Shopping Centre team. They all receive specialist training on autism awareness and will be happy to help you.



If you want, you can use our autism awareness 'Flash Card'

- This card can help if you want to tell our team or shoppers about your autism
- It can be downloaded from our website
- You can also find it at the end of this guide

Difficult situations where you might wish to use the 'Flash Card' might be:

- I am lost, please help
- I have lost something
- I don't feel well
- I need someone who is first aid trained
- I am feeling overwhelmed, please help me find somewhere quiet

Finding my way out **Continued...**

Fire Alarm:

If the centre's fire alarm activates, the voice on the tannoy system will keep you informed with two or three messages:

- 1) to let you know that **we are investigating** the alarm, then:
- 2) either to: instruct you to leave the Shopping Centre, or:
- 3) to inform you that it was a **false alarm**.

Please listen carefully, and if evacuation is necessary - go to the exit nearest to you straight away. All four exits are shown in red on the diagram below.

There are lots of shops at Idlewells Shopping Centre. Our biggest shops are B&M Bargains, New Look, Peacocks and Argos.
